JANUARY 2025: A RECORD START TO THE YEAR FOR THE TUSCAN AIRPORT SYSTEM

Florence, February 5, 2025 – The Tuscan Airport System ushers in 2025 with an unprecedented achievement: in January, the airports of Florence and Pisa recorded a total traffic of **486,000 passengers, exceeding the figures for the same period in 2024 by 5.6%**. This milestone underscores Tuscany's growing appeal as a destination and the effective management of the two airports, with both domestic (+6.2%) and international (+4.7%) traffic growth.

Florence's "Amerigo Vespucci" airport is celebrating its best January ever, with 201,000 passengers and a 3.4% increase over 2024. Driving this growth is the 7.3% increase in commercial passenger flights, which more than offset the slight decline in the aircraft load factor (75.0% compared to 78.0% in January 2024). Domestic traffic was particularly dynamic, up 11.6%, and international traffic was also up (+2.0%). Paris remains the favourite destination for passengers departing from Florence, followed by Barcelona, Rome, London and Madrid.

Pisa's "Galileo Galilei" airport, with 285,000 passengers, shows an increase of 7.2% compared to January 2024, this result was driven by an improvement in load factor (+1.1 percentage points to 84.8%) and an increase in commercial passenger flights (+4.4%). Both traffic segments, international and domestic, show growth (+7.0% and +4.2%, respectively). Tirana ranks first among the most popular destinations for Pisa passengers, followed by London, Palermo, Catania and Bari.

(managing company of the Florence A. Vespucci airport) and SAT - Società Aeroporto Toscano S.p.A. (managing company of the Pisa G. Galilei Airport), Toscana Aeroporti S.p.A. stands out for the complementary nature of the two airports, each with its own specific features: Florence airport focuses on the development of business and leisure traffic through full-service carriers, linking the major European hubs; whereas Pisa airport focuses mainly on tourism traffic operated by low-cost carriers and on cargo flights, paying particular attention to intercontinental connections. The Tuscan Airport System is one of the most important in Italy and is a driver of local economic development in one of the world's best known and most loved regions.
